There is a community meeting scheduled for May 24 at Georgetown Elementary School at 7:00 p.m. The City is hosting the meeting.

PIERS & HARBORS: Laura Bertran mentioned that the slip waiting list is being published in *the Sea Breeze*. Laura has updated the list and weeded out residents that have not renewed their dues (a requirement to remain on the list).

COMMUNITY SURVEY: All surveys are entered in the computer data base. Hopefully, HSIA will begin reporting on results in the next *Sea Breeze*.

BEAUTIFICATION: Noel Gasparin reported that Key School students helped clean up the beach on Earth Day. Earth Day work was a continuation of work started on the community beach clean-up day.

BEACH: Kate Penn reported that the roof is being replaced on the small pavilion and we are painting both pavilions, the entry gate and the swing sets. Despite the rain, 10 volunteers showed up for the community workday at the beach.

SECURITY: Bill Shuman reported that security is going well. The beach guard works on weekends and holidays and splits his time between the beach and the sandspit.


GUEST SPEAKER: Josh Cohen presented comments about the Annapolis City Plan. A question and answer period followed.
