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President's Message

Impact – Minimum Wage

Maryland's new minimum wage law will have a major impact on all of our Community's operational and maintenance expenses. Labor costs are the biggest expense for property maintenance, security, and pool operations and the minimum wage will be increasing from \$7.25 per hour to \$8.25 per hour by the end of June 2015, a 13.7% increase. These costs will not be absorbed by the companies that provide our services, but will be passed through to their client - Hillsmere. The minimum wage will be progressively raised to \$10.10 over the next four years. Ultimately, the total increase in the minimum wage will be 39.3%. You will see these increases reflected in our future budgets as either a reduction in services or an increase in fees and Special Tax assessments.

Join the Community Pool?

It is almost time to join or rejoin the Hillsmere Community Pool. While the summer 2014 season is only half over, it is not too early to think about the 2015 season. For the first time, HSIA will be offering an opportunity to sign up in September for next season at this season's membership rates. As a result of the minimum wage increase, we anticipate that pool operational costs, and our membership rates will increase significantly for the 2015 season. Additional information on how to take advantage of this opportunity will be emailed to the community and posted to our website. **THIS OPPORTUNITY WILL ONLY BE AVAILABLE IN SEPTEMBER.** Join in September and save!

Community Pool Renovation

It is hard to believe that our community pool is 32 years old, but it is. The pool opened in 1982 and many of the children who swam on the Hammerheads that first year are now parents whose children are currently competing for the Hammerheads. Pools are like canines, they age faster than we would like and a 30+ year old pool requires major renovation to continue into the future. The Property Management and Pool Committees will be meeting with pool companies in August to obtain preliminary proposals and cost estimates. In the September General Meeting we will be discussing the proposals and alternatives for financing the needed renovation. Please plan to attend the General Meeting on September 11th.

There was a quorum of members at the meeting.


Paddle Board Classes: Shendon and Kate Grove are requesting approval to offer paddle board instruction at the community beach. **Helene Raven motioned** the Board approve Shendon and Kate Grove meet with Steve Vanderbosch (Board member) to work out details and bring proposals back to the Board at the June Board meeting. Bill Anderson seconded the motion. Vote taken – 6 in favor, 1 abstained (Ray Sullivan).

Variance at 163 E. Bay View Drive: **Mike Penn motioned** the Board oppose the variance for 163 E. Bay View Drive. Mark Carroll seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS: Emergent/Emergency Funding – **Christian Elkington motioned** the Board permit approval of funds in pool situations consistent with the budget and the existing pool contract with the approval of pool chairperson and the President of HSIA with prompt notification to the Board. Mark Carroll seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Delegations of Authority – Christian Elkington motioned** that all delegations of authority shall be in writing. Each delegation shall be specific on the authority granted. When appropriate, delegations shall be posted in a conspicuous location and a copy shall be provided to each contractor where applicable. Bill Anderson seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- 2. HSIA Delinquent Payments – Christian Elkington motioned** that no applications for HSIA membership, Pool membership, Slip Waiting List, ramp keys, slips, party reservations or any current or future membership or service offered by HSIA shall be processed if applicant has an outstanding debt until such debt is paid in full. The President may waive this requirement at his or her discretion with an agreed upon time payment plan in writing. Bill Anderson seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- 3. Key School Traffic Study – Ray Sullivan motioned** that the traffic study requested by Key School being completed because of purchase of athletic fields be extended for the Hillsmere Campus. Christian Elkington seconded the motion. Vote taken – 1 in favor (Ray Sullivan); 6 opposed (Mike Penn, Mark Carroll, Noel Gasparin, Helene Raven, Bill Anderson, Suzanne Martin)

The following motions were approved by a majority of the Board Members present:

Approvals/Appeals: **Bill Anderson motioned** the Board approve a variance to allow building of a ramp to sunroom at 306 Beach Drive. Noel Gasparin seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

OLD BUSINESS: **Suzanne Martin motioned** the Board approve that HSIA can enter into contract for recreational activities that benefit residents as long as the activities are limited to residents and their guests. Ray Sullivan seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Nettle Net – Mark Carroll motioned** the Board approve NTE \$2500 for repair and installation of nettle net. Mike Penn seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- 2. Permitting – Mike Penn motioned** the Board approve NTE \$500 for permit to build a new shed beside the dumpster at the pool. Helene Raven seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- 3. Pet Waste Stations – Suzanne Martin motioned** the Board approve NTE \$2500 for 5 new pet waste stations. Helene Raven seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- 4. Pet Waste Removal – Helene Raven motioned** the Board approve NTE \$2500 for contract of waste removal from pet waste stations. Suzanne Martin seconded the motion. (This contract does not include the 5 new stations.) Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- 5. Beach & Marina Parking Lot – Mike Penn motioned** the Board approve NTE \$2500 for the change order for the beach parking lot and the Sand Spit parking lot. Helene Raven seconded the motion. Discussion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

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BUILDING PERMITS

An HSIA Building Permit is required: Every time an Anne Arundel County Building Permit is required. The responsibility of obtaining an HSIA Building Permit does not fall on your builder, it falls on you.

The following items are needed to obtain an HSIA Building Permit:

1. A copy of the Anne Arundel County Building Permit.
2. A copy of the construction location on the property when required by the County.
3. Cash or check in the amount of \$5.00 made payable to HSIA, unless we sent you a certified letter. If a Certified Letter is required, the cost is \$20 for the permit.
4. Mail to HSIA, P.O. Box 3485, Annapolis, MD 21403

Permits are required for construction of new houses, new sheds, additions to houses or sheds, retaining walls, piers and bulkheads. When in doubt, or if you have any questions, please call the HSIA Building Permit Chairperson, Bill Anderson, at 410-279-1666.

Safe Boating!

Summer has arrived, along with the strong summer winds off the Bay, the occasional thunderstorm, and the resulting choppy waters in Duvall Creek. Slip holders old and new are invited to check out this link:

http://www.frugal-mariner.com/Tying_up_your_boat_in_a_slip.html for a reminder on how to properly tie up their boats. Some of the pilings in the Marina are oddly spaced, so do not hesitate to cross lines over to your neighbor's pilings to properly secure your boat. There are still a number of slip holders who should invest in new and/or heavier mooring lines to protect against damage to their boats, and potentially their neighbors' boats and the marina. We will be conducting some outreach to those slip holders who might benefit from some "seasoned" advice. And remember to check the marine weather forecasts before venturing out, as weather can change quickly.

Please make sure your 2014 Marina sticker is visible on your boat from the bulkhead or piers. Sighting of Marina stickers is the quickest way for Security to confirm that your boat is authorized to be in the Marina. We will be checking all boats for current registration and current HSIA stickers.

Slip Assignments

The Marina is virtually full, and the Slips Waiting List has been completely exhausted, although new names seem to be added weekly as people move into the community. There are still about 30 people on the Slips Waiting List who refused slips in 2014. There also may be one or two slips openings coming up as residents move away and give up their slips. The P&H Slips Committee, under the direction of Bill Barker, has continued to do an excellent job in moving/upgrading current slip holders to new slips, and assigning new slip holders. There are a few slips that, although assigned, have remained vacant, and we will be contacting those slip holders to determine their intentions.

Carry In – Carry Out Trash Policy

The new Carry In – Carry Out Trash Policy and the elimination of trash cans at the Sand Spit and boat ramps has been mostly successful, spoiled only by a few unthinking people who have put trash in the porta-potty and/or the Pet Waste Disposal Stations. Such inconsiderate behavior risks the removal of the porta-potty. A big THANK YOU! to everyone else for practicing and encouraging others to practice the "Carry In – Carry Out" Trash Policy to keep the Marina facilities clean, safe and sanitary. Keep up the good work!

Boat Park

Everyone assigned to the Boat Park is reminded to contact Bill Anderson every time you add or remove a boat and/or trailer to or from the Boat Park, so he can track ownership and be able to contact you if the need arises.

Marina Gate Card Re-Programming

The Marina Gate Control System needs to be re-programmed to add additional cards and de-authorize other cards. Unfortunately, this must be done manually at the gate, and the Marina may have to be

closed to vehicles for several hours as this takes place. Again, thank you for your understanding and patience. Notice will be given prior to the re-programming work and Marina gate closure.

Property Management

HSIA Property Management continues to work on improving the Sand Spit. In the coming weeks, additional gravel will be added where necessary to the Sand Spit to improve the riding/parking surface and drainage. This will be done in conjunction with and following similar work at the Beach parking lot. During this gravel work, **THE MARINA MAY HAVE TO BE CLOSED OR HAVE LIMITED ACCESS FOR SEVERAL HOURS AT A TIME** due to the presence and operation of heavy equipment. Thank you for your patience and understanding. Following the gravel work, additional speed control devices also may be installed. *THANKS* to everyone for *DRIVING SLOWLY* on the Sand Spit. The Sand Spit has a posted 5 mph speed limit. Consider it a “No Wake Zone” and drive at idle! *No Wake = No Dust!*

Property Maintenance

Is the deck planking around your boat getting too funky? The Operations Subcommittee will be organizing a power-washing party in the near future to strip away years of accumulation. An email will go out for volunteers to bring their power washers and their skills to the marina for the all-volunteer party. Remember, many hands make light work!

Towing, Guest Passes

Our contract tower, NCR, has proven to be quite responsive to our request for towing from the Marina:



Be sure your vehicle displays your HSIA vehicle sticker, and that your guests display a Guest Pass in their vehicles. Mirror-hanging Guest parking passes for 2014-15 have been distributed. If you did not get your Guest Passes, you can contact the HSIA Administrator and request them.

All slip holders, ramp key holders, Wait Listers, kayakers, Boat Parkers, etc. are encouraged to attend. Volunteers are needed for various sub-committees, such as Operations, Steering, Slips and Construction. Hope to see you there!

Kayak/Canoe Racks

Thanks to two Eagle Scout Projects, HSIA now has a net increase of 27 rack spaces at the Beach Drive Kayak and Beach Drive Ramp locations. A big “Thank You!” goes out to Scouts Ian Ferris and Drew Dowell. Our Rack Coordinator Sue King has done an excellent job in assigning and reassigning new and old rack spaces, with the result that the Rack Waiting List has been cleared! The even better news is that there are still a few empty rack spaces if anyone wants to sign up. Two notes of caution, however, for rack users: (1) Please do not overload your assigned rack space with too many or too heavy kayaks/canoes; and (2) make sure your kayak/canoe is turned turtle on the rack so rainwater cannot accumulate inside. A cubic foot of water weighs 62.4 lbs.




