
Goodbye Hillsmere,

Mosquito Control – Hillsmere will once again be participating in the Maryland Department of Agriculture’s Mosquito Control Program. Regular surveillance and control of adult mosquitoes will take place from May 30 to October 2, anytime between 7:00 pm to 2:30 am. **Hillsmere’s assigned spray night is Monday.** Spraying for adult mosquitoes will be done only if a Maryland Department of Agriculture Employee determines it necessary. Spraying will not be conducted during rain, in wind speeds exceeding 12 mph, or temperatures above 89 degrees F. Most residents support this program; however, if you prefer to opt-out of spraying at your property, you can elect to not participate. You can find, in this issue of *the Sea Breeze*, MDA’s Standard Mosquito Control Operating Procedures, the Objection to Adult Mosquito Control Policy Statement and a [Request For Exemption From Adult Mosquito Control Services](#) form.

A refundable \$200 security deposit is required when renting the large pavilion. You will need to provide the time and duration of your event. The pavilion may be reserved for the entire day, or for as little as two hours. Please note, reservations are not final until you receive a confirmation from the HSIA Administrator. If you plan to serve alcohol at your party, you are required to obtain an Anne Arundel County One-Day Liquor License. Signed application forms for a liquor license must be obtained from HSIA and submitted to the County as least two weeks prior to the event.



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


Motions from April 2018 Board meeting:

TREASURER: Gene Gross moved that the Board approve, in accordance with Section 10 of the HSIA Bylaws, to have a General Fund audit done each year, in addition to the Special Tax Fund audit each fiscal year. Dave Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

POOL: Mike Waters moved that the Board approve \$2,915 out of the Pool's Improvement budget for a landscaping project to fix pooling water problem inside the pool enclosure. The project will be completed in its entirety by Grounds Management Landscaping and consists of stripping existing grass, regrading area to mitigate pooling water problem and installing sod on the grassy area on the parking lot side of the pool inside the pool fence. Marilyn Carpenter seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

PIERS & HARBOR:

- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board approve, in accordance with the Boat Lift Proposal, Piers & Harbor financing and purchasing five lifts with an option to purchase three more lifts. Marilyn Carpenter seconded the motion. Discussion. Vote taken – approved (Mike Wurst, Steve Vanderbosch, Marilyn Carpenter, Dave Miles, Robin Eilenberg); opposed (Gene Gross); abstained (Mike Waters) – motion passed.
- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board approve the expenditure of P&H funds NTE \$2,000 to The Power House, for: (1) the repair and refurbishing of six ice eaters, per The Power House proposal; (2) the purchase of two ice eater dock mounts; and (3) the purchase and installation of screens on the six repaired ice eaters. Total Power House estimate \$1,888.84. Motion seconded by Gene Gross. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board waive Marina Rules 2.3 and 2.5 for the 2018 season only, to allow a limited number of property owners (no more than 5) to rent a second slip at the Marina. Dave Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board re-authorize the expenditure of funds NTE \$2,500 for landscaping services to restore the drainage ditch along the left (North) side of the Marina driveway. The Board previously authorized this expenditure in 2016, but the work was not contracted or done. Marilyn Carpenter seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

BEACH: Marilyn Carpenter moved the Board approve the expenditure of not more than \$1,700 to Certapro for repairs to large pavilion. Certapro will pressure wash and paint/seal the interior underside of the large pavilion roof and the support beams and columns per proposal. Dave Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

Motions from February 2018 Board meeting:

POOL: Dave Miles motioned the Board approve NTE \$70 per month for a 10 year term for parking lot lighting at the Pool (provider BGE Public Space Lighting Program). Steve Vanderbosch seconded the motion. Vote taken – 6 in favor (Gene Gross, Dave Miles, Teresa Sutherland, Ray Sullivan, Steve Vanderbosch, Mike Waters; 1 abstained (Robin Eilenberg); motion passed.

TREASURER’S REPORT:

- Gene Gross moved the Board award the grass cutting and trash pickup to Price Cutters at the per cut rate as submitted and the trash pickup from the beach for \$150 per month. Steve Vanderbosch seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.
- Gene Gross moved the Board award the Pet Waste Collection (7 stations) to Suzanne Martin for \$20 per week. Dave Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – 5 in favor (Dave Miles, Ray Sullivan, Steve Vanderbosch, Robin Eilenberg, Gene Gross); 2 abstained (Mike Waters, Teresa Sutherland); motion passed.

ADMINISTRATIVE: Ray Sullivan moved the Board approve the METAVivor Race for a Sunday in June. Dave Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – unanimously approved.

BOARD ONLY EMAIL ETIQUETTE: Teresa Sutherland moved the Board adopt the Board Only Email Etiquette policy with removal of the last sentence. Mike Waters seconded the motion. Discussion. Robin Eilenberg does not see a need for this policy. Steve Vanderbosch Moved the Board postpone this discussion on the motion until the March Board meeting. Dave Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – 6 in favor (Gene Gross, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Dave Miles, Mike Waters, Steve Vanderbosch); 1 opposed (Robin Eilenberg); motion passed. Teresa Sutherland’s motion is tabled until the March Board meeting.

Motions from March 2018 Board meeting:

POOL: Marilyn Carpenter moved the Board approve NTE \$4,100. out of the pool budget for furniture – ten (10) lounge chairs, one (1) high-top table, four (4) high-top chairs, and three (3) additional umbrellas, purchased through Anchor Aquatics (estimate attached). \$4,100. Includes an estimate for freight/shipping, which is estimated on the high end, so the total will likely be slightly less. David Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken - 6 in favor (Mike Waters, Ray Sullivan, Marilyn Carpenter, Teresa Sutherland, David Miles, Gene Gross), 2 opposed (Robin Eilenberg & Steve Vanderbosch), 2 abstained (Mike Penn & Michael Waters.) Motion approved.

PIERS & HARBOR:

- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board approve a contract with Allied Well Drilling, in an amount NTE \$4,000. from P&H funds, to provide and install a constant water pressure system at the HSIA Marina. Ray Sullivan seconded the motion. Vote taken - 9 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg, Gene Gross, David Miles, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Steve Vanderbosch, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 1 abstained (Mike Penn). Motion approved.
- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board to authorize executing a Towing Service Contract with Top Notch Towing and Transport, LLC, to provide call-in towing service for HSIA Community Marina. There is no cost to HSIA; all fees are paid by the registered owners of towed vehicles. Towing services can be authorized by Mike Penn, HSIA President, Matt Franz, HSIA Security Committee Chairman, or Steve Vanderbosch, HSIA P&H Chairman. Discussion. David Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – 9 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg,

- Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board approve the expenditure of NTE \$2,600. from Special Tax funds, for the provision and spreading of gravel on the Sand Spit travel and parking areas as needed, provided by the low bidder Jones of Annapolis. Mike Wurst seconded the motion. Vote taken – 9 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg, Gene Gross, David Miles, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Steve Vanderbosch, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 1 abstained (Mike Penn). Motion approved.

BEACH:

- Marilyn Carpenter moved the Board approve \$2,595. from Special Tax (Repairs) to purchase netting (\$1,940.), chain (\$505.), and zip ties (\$150.), in order to create a new nettle net for the beach. David Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – 9 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg, Gene Gross, David Miles, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Steve Vanderbosch, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 1 abstained (Mike Penn). Motion approved.
- Marilyn Carpenter moved the Board approve \$2,350. from Special Tax (Grounds & Maintenance) for Annapolis Diving Contractors (ADC) to order supplies, cut chain, transport supplies and install the 600’ of netting, chains and zip ties. Ray Sullivan seconded the motion. Vote taken – 7 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Gene Gross, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Steve Vanderbosch, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 2 opposed (Robin Eilenberg, David Miles), 1 abstained (Mike Penn). Motion approved.
- Marilyn Carpenter moved the Board approve \$2,750. from Special Tax to have Price Cutters replace a 60’ section of 6x6 perimeter decayed timbers with marine-grade wood (6x6), on east side of 2-5 playground. Remove pentagon shaped timbers surrounding tree and replace with timbers enclosing tree. Apply dirt and mulch to enclosed tree area. Assemble two (2) benches and install one (1) bench on each side of tree near new timbers. Teresa Sutherland seconded the motion. Vote taken – 9 in favor, dependent on Noel Gasparin reviewing and approving the written contract with Price Cutters (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg, Gene

Gross, David Miles, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Steve Vanderbosch, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 1 abstained (Mike Penn). Motion approved, dependent upon Noel Gasparin reviewing and approving the written contract with Price Cutters.

RAIN GARDEN MAINTENANCE: Gene Gross moved the Board award Cleanup Maintenance and Mulching of the Rain Gardens to American Lawn & Landscaping for \$10,290. Includes three (3) cleanups (@ \$1,680./ea), and quarterly mulching (totaling \$5,250.). A 4th cleanup is optional, at an additional cost of \$1,680. Source of funds: Special Tax. Steve Vanderbosch seconded the motion. Vote taken – 9 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg, Gene Gross, David Miles, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Steve Vanderbosch, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 1 abstained (Mike Penn). Motion approved.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT CONTRACT: Gene Gross moved the

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

David Miles seconded the motion. Vote taken – 7 in favor (Marilyn Carpenter, Robin Eilenberg, David Miles, Ray Sullivan, Teresa Sutherland, Michael Waters, Mike Wurst), 1 opposed (Gene Gross), 2 abstained (Steve Vanderbosch, Mike Penn). Motion approved.

BOAT RAMP CONSULTANT: Steve Vanderbosch moved the Board approve award of a contract (attached) for professional engineering and permitting services in connection with the Sunset Drive Boat Ramp reconstruction and pier improvements to Near Shore Engineering, LLC in the amount of \$10,000. 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Operation Clearwater

Hello Neighbors,


It's that time of year again, when the weather warms up, the sunscreen comes out of last year's beach bag, and we all go looking for a way to wash the falling pollen off of ourselves. In case you prefer a more natural setting than the community pool can offer, the South River beckons you to cool your feet and stretch your limbs with a swim. Plus, the beach has shells and sticks and seaweed for all your junior castle-builders to decorate their masterpieces with.

I encourage everyone to get out and enjoy this lovely natural resource we have right in our own backyard, but there are a few things you should know before you go swimming in the River. First, HSIA participates in Operation Clearwater with the South River Federation (SRF). Operation Clearwater is a monitoring program that assesses our community beach for the presence of harmful bacteria that can cause digestive issues if swallowed, or infections for open wounds. Between Memorial Day and Labor Day, SRF staff come out every week to sample the water and have it analyzed at the Anne Arundel Community College. Check results on the [SRF website](#) or with the [SwimGuide app](#) to get the most up-to-date information on the water quality at our community beach (and most other swimming holes in the County). Second, we work hard to keep the beach and the River's bottom clean, but we can't control the tides, and sometimes sharp things wash up. If you're going swimming, put on some sandals or other shoes and protect your feet. Third, wait two days after a rain before swimming. Anne Arundel County maintains a standing advisory against swimming within 48 hours of a 1/2 inch or greater rainfall.

Finally, get out there and have fun. In 2017, Operation Clearwater testing showed that Hillsmere beach was safe for swimming 87% of the time. With our stunning view of the River's mouth and the Bay's main stem comes a great deal of tidal flushing, keeping the water at our swimming beach cleaner than many others. We are truly fortunate to have such a great setting in which to fire up the grill and watch our kids play in the River (or go playing ourselves). Don't let another summer go by without enjoying that.

As always, if you have any questions about Operation Clearwater, if you see anything amiss on or near the water, or want to share that beautiful picture of a sunset or the local fauna (kids included) please reach out to me.



Check in Procedures

Membership cards must be presented to the lifeguard upon every visit to the pool. All members have their own membership card (regardless of age), and must be presented to the lifeguard at the check in desk upon arrival. Please make every attempt to bring your membership cards and check in during every visit. It helps to ensure that only members and their guests are using the pool, and it helps the lifeguards get to know our members. Thank you for your cooperation.

Operating Rules



As always, our #1 priority at the Hillsmere Pool is safety, and prevention is the best safeguard for accidents. Our operating rules are in place for the safety of our patrons and will be enforced by the lifeguards. Swim Test and Non-Swimmers

All children under the age of 16 must pass a basic swim test administered by the lifeguard, and wear a life-guard issued wristband before using the main pool without direct adult supervision. The swim test consists of swimming the length of the main pool and treading water continuously for one minute. Children under 16 who have not passed the swim test are considered "non-swimmers".

NON-SWIMMERS

- A non-swimmer is anyone under the age of 16 who is not able to pass the swim test.
- Non-swimmers may not come to the pool without adult supervision.
- When using the pool, the guardian must be engaged and within arm's reach of their non-swimmer.
- Non-swimmers who are not adequately supervised by a responsible adult will be asked to exit the water for the safety of the non-swimmer.

Special Community Benefit District Funds

Admission to, or use of, the pool facilities will be granted to any Hillsmere property owner consistent with the expenditure of Special Community Benefit District funds for the maintenance, repair or renovation of the pool facility. The pool will be open to all Hillsmere property owners regardless of pool membership status on the last Tuesday of each month for the 2018 season:

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

Boating Season Is Here!

Pleasant weather has finally arrived, and it is good to see so much boating activity at the Marina and Boat Ramps. By now everyone should have their boats in their assigned slips, or notified the Slips Committee of any delays. We will be surveying the Marina in June to see if any assigned slips are not yet occupied and try to determine why they are vacant. Please ensure your 2018 HSIA Marina sticker is visible on your boat.

There will be some continuing turnover of slips as boats are sold or residents move. As of June 1 we still have about 10 unassigned slips, which means we will have slips available for guests and transients, as well as to offer to new residents moving into Hillsmere. The Slips Committee will continue to fill slips throughout the boating season.

Marina Maintenance

There will be some Marina maintenance going on, including replacing burned out dock lights, replacement of the water system backflow preventer, and fire extinguisher inspection/weighing. Other projects include restoration of the drainage ditch alongside the Marina driveway, and placement of gravel on the Sand Spit driving lane.

The Anne Arundel County Fire Department conducted its annual inspection of the Marina with two items to note: (1) the standpipe system requires a 5-year pressure test (to be scheduled); and (2) critical comments on light-duty extension cords being plugged into 30-amp shore power plugs using pigtails or adaptors. Unless step-down transformers are used on the 30-amp adaptor plugs, light duty extension cords should be run to light pole 20-amp outlets. We will be contacting individual slip holders about this issue.

Norm Johansen will be leading an effort to replacing damaged piling caps throughout the Marina. Anyone who can help on occasion with this effort to remove damaged copper caps and install plastic caps, please contact Norm at normjohansen@gmail.com or 443-822-8945.

Guest Passes, Parking, Towing, Speed Limit

Guest Passes. New Guest parking passes were issued this year for 2018-19. If you did not get Guest Passes or need additional ones, contact the HSIA Administrator. Each new slip holder is offered two Guest Passes, and can have more if needed. Be sure your vehicle displays your HSIA vehicle sticker, and that your guests display a Guest Pass in their vehicles.

New Towing Contractor. We have contracted with a new towing Company—Top Notch Towing and Transport, a local firm which should be very responsive. The HSIA Board has authorized towing of vehicles from the Marina parking area if the vehicles do not display an appropriate sticker or Guest Pass.

Speed Limit. The Marina Speed Limit is 5 MPH, which means you should be driving at idle speed. The speed bumps are there as reminders. *Please drive slowly!!*

2018 Maryland Clean Marina Pledge

We have signed a 2018 Maryland Clean Marina Pledge, committing to actively pursuing full standing as a Maryland Clean Marina, by implementing and maintaining appropriate pollution prevention practices and applying to DNR for recognition as a Maryland Clean Marina.

Sunset Ramp

Anne Arundel County has advised that a Special Exception Permit will be required for the reconstruction of the Sunset Drive Boat Ramp, which was not required 30 years ago when the ramp was last rebuilt. Our consultant Near Shore Engineering has initiated the permit process for the necessary federal, State and County permits.

Boat Lifts

The HSIA Board has given preliminary approval to the following Boat Lift Proposal:

- HSIA will purchase and install 10,000 pound, low-profile boat lifts in 4 or 5 slips (C-Dock, slips 4-8) using P&H retained earnings (reserves). The lifts will accommodate power boats of 25 feet or less.

- These slips will be rented with an annual rental fee that will amortize the cost of the lifts over 10 years, plus the underlying slip fee and annual maintenance costs. We are expecting the total lift cost to be about \$8,000 per lift with a projected annual lift slip fee of approximately \$1,800 per year. Residents who have expressed interest in renting these lifts will be asked to sign letters of intent to rent these lift slips before P&H decides on the number of lifts and starts the permitting process.



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The P&H Committee is now soliciting bids/proposals from boat lift providers.

Boat Park

Offers were sent out to all 17 people on the Boat Park Wait List, offering them space in the Boat Park for this year, but few have responded.

STANDARD MOSQUITO CONTROL OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR 2018

HILLSMERE SHORES HAS BEEN ASSIGNED MONDAYS. Hillsmere Shores will only ever be sprayed on Mondays.

OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR SPRAYING OF ADULTICIDES (Treatment for Adult Mosquitoes):

- Regular surveillance and control of adult mosquitoes May 30 - October 2. Spraying can occur any time between 7PM - 2:30AM.
Spraying for adult mosquitoes will only be done if a Department of Agriculture Employee determines it is necessary.
Spraying will not be conducted during rain, in winds exceeding 12 MPH, or temperatures above 89°F
Thresholds for Ground-Based ULV Treatments:
Landing Counts = 3 mosquitoes in a 2 minute count
Light Trap Collections = 12 female mosquitoes in an un-baited light trap overnight or 24 female mosquitoes in a baited light trap overnight
Conditions that threaten public health, such as mosquito-borne disease(s)

OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR SPRAYING OF LARVICIDES (Treatment for Mosquito Larvae):

- County-wide Surveillance and Control of Larval Mosquitoes from April - October, Monday - Friday, between 8:30AM - 4:30PM.
Larvicides to be used (this list is subject to additions and other revisions):

Table with 2 columns: Larvicides, Formulations. Includes Bacterial Larvicides (VectoBac, Spheratax) and Insect Growth Regulator (Altosid).

The Mosquito Control Program does not spray for Midges that swarm homes, boats, trees and/or shrubs along many Anne Arundel County creeks and rivers. These non-biting insects develop in mud bottoms of slow moving waterways of low dissolved oxygen and will decline in numbers within a few weeks after they first appear.

- Residents who do not wish their property to be sprayed may file an exemption. The exemption policy and form can be found on our website: http://mda.maryland.gov/plants-pests/Pages/mosquito_control_policy.aspx

MOSQUITO CONTROL POLICY STATEMENT

OBJECTION TO ADULT MOSQUITO CONTROL

The policy of the Maryland Department of Agriculture regarding an objection to adult mosquito control by truck-mounted ultra low volume (ULV) application of insecticides is as follows:

- ! An individual may have his/her owned or leased real property and a surrounding buffer up to 300 feet on all sides of the property excluded from ground based ULV adult mosquito control.
- ! Each individual requesting this exclusion must submit the request in writing to the Maryland Department of Agriculture and provide copies to the appropriate community association or city/town. The request must provide the address of the property to be excluded and must be signed by the owner(s) or leasee(s). This request will be acknowledged in writing by the Department.
- ! If the number of individual objectors and the location of excluded properties precludes an effective mosquito control adulticide service in a community, the service in that community will be suspended. Service may be reinstated upon the written request of the community and approval by the Department.
- ! A city/town or community association may request the Department to rescind or modify a spray exclusion zone if the local authority believes the exemption unfairly impacts other residents who desire adult mosquito control service. Requests to rescind or modify spray exclusion requests must be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of Agriculture.
- ! The Department periodically will verify the continued occupancy/ownership by objectors of properties excluded from ULV ground spraying to determine if the objection continues.
- ! In the event of mosquito-borne disease or conditions that threaten public health, the suspension of mosquito adulticide service in an area due to objectors will be discontinued and the full range of mosquito control procedures available will be utilized.

PUBLIC INFORMATION NOTICE:

Your **request for exemption from adult mosquito control services** by the Maryland Department of Agriculture **WILL NOT** be processed unless **ALL** of the information requested has been supplied. You have a right to inspect, amend, or correct this information. Under State Government Article, 10-617, Annotated Code of Maryland, this information may be generally available for public inspection. This information is not routinely shared with state, federal, or local government agencies.
